100 YEARS OF MARIST PRESENCE IN MOUNT ST MARY'S, MILLTOWN, DUBLIN

After a century of presence in Mount Saint Mary's, the Marists in Ireland closed the doors of this important house. Mount St Mary's has served as a formation house, a base for local pastoral ministry, missionary work and community life.

Alois Greiler (Ger) has just published a centenary souvenir book. In it he has included some reminiscences of Marists past and present to give it a personal touch: "The Mount St Mary's Golden Jubilee book (1970) ended on an optimistic note. The 1980s did see the Marist formation house in Dublin full, active and promising. However, by the end of the 1980s change was in the air. The number of candidates began to drop, some chose another path, and Marist formation moved on to a more international level. Marist formation ceased in Milltown in 1992. The house became a residence for different priestly ministries, with non-Marists staying in





the house while studying in Dublin. From 1920 to 2020 the campus had grown to a number of buildings finally too costly for too few residents...

Mount St. Mary's will always be a house of great importance for Marists from Ireland, England and many other countries who have done part of their formation there or worked as formators in Dublin... This centenary book tries to honour the story and the people and the place... Hopefully, it helps us to recall stories and to reflect on this very important example of formation in the Society of Mary." REFLECTION SHEETS ON THE THEME OF SOLIDARITY MINISTRY





Reflecting on Vocation Fostering ministry - Zoom meeting, 10 December

Ten confreres came together on Zoom to reflect on the meaning of vocation fostering in their countries. The 2017 General Chapter emphasised that this ministry is the responsibility of each Marist, therefore it is important for the province to develop a common understanding of the challenges which this ministry entails today. Some topics which arose during the conversation were: (i) the



place of laity in the ministry, (ii) sharing the Marist vision of Church with another generation (iii) opening doors to reach potential candidates, (iv) the strength of personal and group conviction amongst Marists about the relevance of our vocation today, and (v) the means available to us to communicate the Marist vocation both by our way of living and use of promotional material. Our reflection will continue throughout the province of Europe in the coming year.
