### NEWS FROM THE LAUDATO SI PROJECT (YAOUNDE, CAMEROON)



Luigi Savoldelli sm writes: "The work is going well despite the very long period of drought and heat which have caused four fires in recent months. After the drought came the rains with violent winds that caused enormous damage, uprooting many trees. In addition to the ordinary and daily activities, 'extraordinary' works are also

continuing, and we managed to complete the construction of the solar power system. It is truly a blessing because for almost a month, between



interruptions and damage, we had no electricity, and we had to use generators, which are very expensive. The work is not limited to cultivating the land or digging a well for water and thus to be able to quench the thirst of people, animals and the crops. But beyond each action, there is the profound meaning, dedicated to the poorest and most vulnerable, to help

## INTRODUCING THE MONCALIERI COMMUNITY (TURIN, ITALY)



Villa Santa Maria in Moncalieri has been home to the Marist Fathers since 1907. The house welcomed the second novitiate after the expulsion of religious from France. Father Georges David, secretary to Father Colin, died in Moncalieri in 1907 and is buried in the local cemetery. In 1922 it was the temporary residence of the general administration. From 1925 to the 1980s, the house was used by the Italian Marists as a novitiate or scholasticate house. Since the mid-1980s it has been a home for students and workers. The association *'Il Ricino'*, which houses women

with children, operates in the adjoining building. The Marist community of Moncalieri is set up to welcome elderly and sick confreres. Marists according to their own charism and availability, are involved in animating the liturgy in some convents and in pastoral ministry of parishes and chaplaincies nearby, and in providing psychotherapy.

Currently in the community we are: Bruno Rubechini (superior), Mauro Filippucci, Giuseppe Fontana, Giancarlo Balzi, Mario Castellucci (national administrator), Marcello Pregno (national bursar), and attached: Renzo Pasotti (Brescia). For the future, we hope to continue the services currently rendered in the local area and welcome the elderly and sick. We would also like to strengthen the collaboration with Marist laity and other Christians in the locality.
