After five and a half years with us, Father Jan Hulshof will be leaving us in February 2024 to return to his native country, the Netherlands. Still young at 82, Father Jan has left his mark on the life of La Neylière since his arrival in September 2018. A great intellectual, methodical and a lover of conversation, an evening pianist, a walker, he is always thirsty for new knowledge, which he happily shares with us. Along

with everybody, he has faced up to the time of Covid, which took the life of our confrere Father Paul Loubaresse. Jan says: "Paul was a cheerful companion with whom I enjoyed walking in the mountains of the Haut-Lyonnais or visiting Fourvière and L'Hermitage. He was able to demonstrate his qualities as a good confrere, charming, attentive and generous with his time by helping me to get in touch with our Marist sources and our beautiful heritage". In September 2023, after a sabbatical in Quebec, my homeland, I joined Jean-Marie, Georges and Jan at the La Neylière community. My religious life was spent mainly in Africa (Senegal and Cameroon) where I spent more than half my life in pastoral service in parishes, chaplaincy at the college in Dakar and in the formation of young Marists in Yaoundé. I even had a little experience as master of novices in Africa at the time of Covid (2020-2022). I'm happy to be back here, at La Neylière, where I did my novitiate 54 years ago, this blessed place where our founder, Father Jean-Claude Colin, lived his last years and where he rests in our beautiful oratory, beneath the great fresco dedicated to the Virgin Mary of Pentecost. I'm looking forward to the jubilee year of 2025, the 150th anniversary of Jean-Claude Colin's death, and I hope with all my heart that he will be beatified for this great event. This place is peaceful and conducive to action and contemplation. A place is available for another confrere. A great welcome awaits you.

## FROM SAINTE-FOY-LÈS-LYON TO RUE SALA

Pascal Boidin, sm reports: "The confrères are now based at 12 rue Sala, in Lyon city centre, between Place Bellecour and the train station Perrache. Five have moved Roger Lordong, there: Bernard Boisseau, Jean Chevillard, Paul Fontanier and Paul Souga, an African confrere sabbatical. on



Etienne Mansaly, a young Senegalese man, has also moved to rue Sala, where he provides services to the confreres in exchange for a low rent. Philippe and Michel Guerre are staying at the Domitys residence. Xavier Béchetoile is in a special facility.

I was able to spend a week with the community just after Christmas. The building on rue Sala belongs to the Œuvres Pontificales Missionnaires (OPM), whose offices are on the 1st floor. The top 3 floors are rented by the Marist community. The 3rd and 4th floors are each divided into three flats, and the 5th floor contains the common rooms, an oratory and a flat. The confreres are gradually getting used to their new environment. They live next door to the Marist Sisters, who regularly attend mass with us.


# MINISTRY OF INTERCESSION
