Each country and region is organising activities to commemorate the event. We propose that our " Montée à Fourvière " is characterized by

*“Fourvière is a promise that has given us a lot of life and has certainly given a lot of service to the world,”* he added.

The encounter will focus on the celebration of the pledge at Fourvière 200 years ago by twelve young seminarians and newly ordained, and the preparation of the bicentennial of the founding of the Marist Brothers.

According to Fr Alejandro, the programme will include *“moments in which we are together, moments in small communities throughout the encounter, moments in which the youth of the four Marist branches will visit historical places such as L’Hermitage, La Neylière, Belley and Sainte-Foy.”*

The gathering will take place in the Marist School of Sainte Marie Lyon – La Solitude, located on the hill of Fourvière and the youth will stay at the Lycée Aux Lazaristes high school.

Since then, we have generally had eight or nine present as we follow the 15 Marist themes over the course of the next year. ## PERU: LAY MARISTS FROM CALLAO

The first group of **YOUNG Lay Marists of "San José Parish School"** made up of former students, reunited on March 17th, 2016. They meet monthly and give support to the different pastoral groups in our school. They also receive formation in our Marist spirit.

The Lay Marists are getting together to prepare for the Bicentenary of the Fourvière Pledge. A schedule of activities has been made with the three Marist Laity groups in Callao (Santa Rosa Parish, Virgen de la Misericordia Parish, and San José Parish School, with the support of the Marist priests.)

The activities scheduled are:

- **April.** We held a "*Day of Gratitude*". Understanding the Celebration of the Eucharist presided by Reverend Miguel Ángel Contreras S.M. and a *pilgrimage* to the Baquijano Cemetery. We celebrated Saint Peter Chanel for 3 days with a solemn Mass to remember his martyrdom
- **May:** We are discussing; "*Mary in the Marist Lay Spirit*" by Monseigneur Luis Sebastiani S.M.
- **June:** We are planning reflection "*How to live out the Fourvière Pledge today as Marist laity*", by Reverend Fransico Aller Fernandez S.M.
- **July:** The whole parish community and the Callao Marist Laity are invited to the Celebration of the Eucharist. We will take advantage of the year of

Mercy indulgences, later sharing with everyone in the Parish room. Then, Marist Laity and the Marist Fathers will share lunch in the San Jose Parish School auditorium.

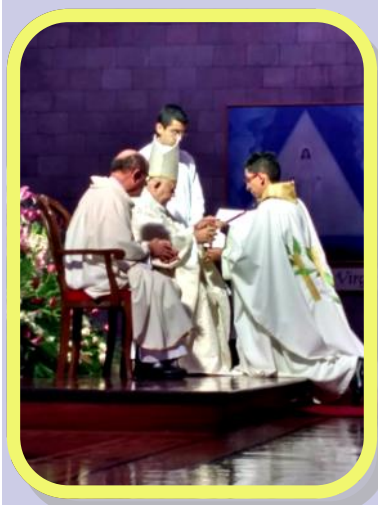


### The Ordination of David Sanchez SM

During the weekend of 13-14 February, the European coordination committee and the Council of the Marist Fathers met in Paris to think about follow-up actions to take on between the Society of Mary and Lay Marists. After our meeting at Los Negrals (summer 2015), the subject of collaboration in the same mission with the same Marist spirit, was quite strengthened and highlighted the desire to find common projects between the two branches of the Marist Family.

Some specific actions to start with were set at the meeting, such as the presence of some delegates of Marist Laity at the General Chapter of the Marist Fathers in 2017. The contribution to this gathering will be prepared by each group in the countries where Marist Laity are active, so that the voice of Marist Laity may be “present” at the Chapter through communication of our experiences, sharing, wishes and comments lived about our Lay mission journey with Marist Fathers so far.

This matter is also a response to one of the most remarkable thoughts of Father Colin when he said that, in current words, *“the Marist Laity was an important part of the Society and could not be detached from it, in its mission or identity”*. There has always been a desire to follow this vision and, brought into our current situation, we, Fathers and Lay Marists are being called to work together.

**NEW ZEALAND** Our challenge has been our administrator for 23 years, Jane Langham, retiring. We relocated the office from Wellington to Auckland and share a Laity Centre with Logos Marist Youth Team. Vanessa Ornelas is now managing the distribution of monthly material and the register of prayer for dedicating unborn and new-born babies to the care of ***Our Lady of Good Hope***. Both ministries are well received and combined with the Marist Laity Facebook presence reach far beyond committed Laity or Catholics. **Fiji:** I was privileged to go to Fiji to lead the Laity retreat at Tutu Marist Centre on Taveuni. However Cyclone Winston intervened and I spent five days with the Marist Sisters in Nadi instead. The destruction was severe with 42 deaths and the economic and social cost inestimable. I encourage Marist Laity to keep praying for the people of Fiji and for the Marist missions and schools there. They sustained heavy damage. Donations can be made to the Marist Religious branches in New Zealand and Fiji. I met a small group of the Lay Marists in Nadi and was encouraged by their Marist mission.

## **Fourvière Day**

We celebrate with the Marist family in Auckland on the 23rd July. The Keynote speaker is Fr Justin Taylor SM. There will be a celebration lunch, Mass and workshops by Marist Religious and Laity on a range of topics aimed at exploring the significance of the Fourvière pledge in our lives and mission today.

Several Marist missions in Fiji were severely affected by Cyclone Winston, according to a report by Fr Pio Fong Waqavotuwale, SM.

At the Tutu Rural Training Centre in Taveuni, 22 buildings were either completely or partially destroyed. These were staff houses, dormitories, workshops, hall and kitchens. Tens of thousands of kava and dalo plants, many belonging to student farmers, have been damaged. Tutu has a large active group of Lay Marist families.



St John's College in Cawaci, Ovalau, sustained extensive damage to school buildings, girls' dormitories, teachers' and staff quarters, the church, convent and presbytery.



- The ablutions block for these dormitories was blown down.
- The church has half of its roof ripped off, including the roofs of the two steeples.
- The presbytery also has half of its roof blown away and its balcony upstairs wrecked.
- The convent by the girls' dormitories has its roof completely ripped off as well.

The only buildings that were intact, with minor damage, were six dormitories for the boys.

Principal Fr 'Ekuasi Manu said the rebuilding of the school will be administered by Fiji's Ministry of Education.

The heritage group has been to assess the damage to the church and so the urgent need now is the repair of the presbytery and the convent, for which the ministry will not take responsibility.

Loreto primary school in Sacred Heart parish, Levuka, has been completely destroyed.

## NEW CALEDONIA:

*A message from Fr François.* In what is considered the most powerful cyclone to ever to hit Fiji 42 people died.

It is primarily the north of the main island of Viti Levu which was struck in the night from Saturday to Sunday, and the small surrounding islands, where entire villages were swept by winds reaching 315 Burst kilometers per hour. Hundreds of buildings and residential houses were totally destroyed, infrastructure (roads and bridges, telephone and electrical networks) have also been hit hard.

Local authorities have officially appealed Tuesday for international help and in response the United Nations and the Pacific Humanitarian Team are involved. Many international countries are engaged in providing funds and support for the rebuilding of lives and the economy.

great success. Laity from the Philippines, Kiribati, New Zealand and around Australia attended. Saturday morning Fr Michael Whelan SM led us in reflection and prayer on Mercy and the need for faith to be 'conversation' with God, within ourselves and amongst one another. He suggested true conversation is always open to growth and transformation. We need to be vulnerable to truly encounter the other and be willing to be changed by each encounter if we are to live mercy in Mary's way.

On Saturday afternoon the different groups and country representatives shared on the situation in their areas. We had presentations on progress toward better communication amongst Lay groups in the Philippines, struggles with rising sea levels in Kiribati, a range of experiences and groups in New Zealand and Australia and the emerging Brothers and LayChampagnat Association in Australia.

On the Sunday Fr Peter McMurrich gave us an inspiring walk through history as we went on a mini-pilgrimage to the Marist places around Sydney. Fr Robert Barber, Provincial of the Society of Mary Australia, celebrated Mass for the group at St Peter Chanel and the day concluded with afternoon tea with the Marist Sisters at Woolwich.
