SEDOS MEETING: "MISSION IN A PLURALISTIC WORLD"



Last week Frs Paul Walsh and Ben McKenna were among the attendees coming from all continents at the SEDOS meeting in Ariccia. [SEDOS](#) (Service of documentation and study on global mission) – is a forum open to Institutes of Consecrated Life which commit themselves to deepening their understanding of global mission. The theme was 'Mission in a pluralistic world' and brought the focus on how to constructively utilize inter-religious dialogue for furthering the reign of the God here on earth. Presentations were made by Jewish, Moslem, and Buddhist practitioners and scholars who are also well-versed in the Christian tradition. The papers will soon be available on the website.

They are temporarily hosted in the General House, until they will be able to find appropriate housing themselves and continue their new life in Italy.
