The topics for the meeting are: the Marist heritage places in France, with their related significance, challenges and concerns; the *International Gathering of Marist Youth* which took place in Guatemala in January and which has been a significant encounter for all Marists; and dreams and plans for new ways of collaboration as Marists in the future.

The annual meeting which rotates its hosting unit enjoyed the beautiful weather and hospitality of Oceania's Samoa Sector.
