MARIST STUDIES SUMMER SCHOOL

During the Northern Hemisphere Summer, from 20 July to 30 August of this year the first *Marist Studies Summer School* will take place in La Neylière. The proposal for the program was made during the last ARC meeting. Fr Larry Duffy will be the director of the program this year.

Some of the goals of the program are:

- To broaden the exposure of confreres to the world of our Colinian charism and spirit through guided study and reflection on Marist sources
- to actually produce some material – in whatever form - on “things Marist” for the wider Society.
- Where appropriate, participants will be asked to present to the wider world the fruit of their study. The hope would also be to discover confreres who have the desire and the capacity to carry this discipline forward in the Society.

Ideally the program will be held on a regular basis.

Praying to Fr Colin




The new website for Jean-Claude Colin has a page containing a small but growing list of people in various
